D. PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

1. Niagara Catholic Parent Involvement Committee (NCPIC) Report

At the end of June, I was very happy to know that I would be joining this vibrant, diverse school community in the south end of Niagara Falls. I along with my colleagues Monique Mastroianni and Dino Germano make up the admin team at STM. I am blessed to work with this admin team and their many years of experience in catholic education. Along with the new administration, we have 22 new staff members at Saint Michael

including support and teaching staff.

The school's current enrolment is just under 1100 students. Just about every classroom, during every period is in use. Teachers are in a good groove in delivering curriculum during the school day. Our SAA (Student Academic Assistance) program is well under way running 4 days per week — Mondays- Thursdays from 2:30pm — 4pm. Along with peer tutoring support, subject specific teachers are available each night.

We thank Casablanca Inn for providing food service to our students for the first couple weeks of the school year. Chartwell's started service at Saint Michael on September 18th and will offering food at Saint Michael daily from 7:30am – 1pm. Students can access the cafeteria before school and during lunches. From the feedback that I have been hearing so far, the reviews on quality of food, pricing and portions have been positive.

Today, we had our Gr. 8 classes from our 4 feeder schools come to the school for a transition activity. Chef Scozzafava and his students prepared a hotdog lunch followed by a Mustang football game vs. Blessed Trinity. As a added bonus, Cool licks Food Truck was onsite to offer ice cream treats for all students. Very proud of our Athletic Council and their leadership in organizing and leading this event.

This week has been Truth and Reconciliation Week in appreciation of the hardships faced by the Indigenous peoples of Canada with residential schools. On Friday, Sept. 29th students and staff are encouraged to wear Orange Shirts to symbolize the collective commitment that Every Child Matters. We are super lucky to have Father Sojan from Our Lady of Mount Carmel at STM on Sept. 29th for our opening school masses. It is an excellent opportunity for us to celebrate our faith, connecting our faith with Truth and Reconciliation. We will kick off our annual Pilgrimage campaign in support of our brothers and sisters in Rwanda with our kickoff assemblies during the week of Oct. 2nd. Under the leadership of our Pilgrimage committee made up of students and staff, our Pilgrimage will be held on October 25th. We will walk to Our Lady of Mount Carmel after school, celebrate Mass with Father Sojan then walk back to the school. Students will receive 5 hours of community service for raising a minimum of \$25 of donation and completing walk. This year's theme is "Rebuilding Together". With a donation amount of \$50, students will receive a Pilgrimage Tshirt. Parents/Guardians are continued to be reminded that student achievement can be accessed throughout the school year on the Parent Portal. It's important to stay connected to your child's high school experience. Please reach out to classroom teachers with any questions. Parent-Teacher interviews will be held on November 22nd.
